1. Course General Description

This course is offered in the **Humanities Track** in **semester one**. The aim of this **pre-intermediate** course (**A2**) is to build on the four language areas and develop students' listening and reading comprehension, spoken and written production, common communication strategies, and grammar. Students will be able to identify the main points of simple listening and reading texts, locate key vocabulary, initiate and interact in simple social exchanges, provide brief descriptions and explanations, and construct connected text on familiar topics.

4. Course Main Objective(s)

1. Follow, identify and extract information from simple listening and reading passages on familiar topics.
2. Identify the main ideas of simple texts, and recognize high-frequency vocabulary.
3. Follow simple listening and reading texts to make simple inferences.
4. Initiate, engage in and sustain simple interactions and exchanges.
5. Express opinion, simple descriptions, reasons and explanations on familiar topics.
6. Speak with clarity and intelligibility in simple interactions and exchanges.
7. Employ and apply simple communicative strategies to improve comprehension and extract meaning and information.
8. Construct legible sentences and paragraphs conveying clear ideas while demonstrating some grammatical and orthographical control.
9. Construct texts describing experiences, and offering personal opinion.
